




- Project started the way most ROW

- Who owns ROW? Who manages ROW?


- Located in SE4 S16, T17N, R1E, SM
- Road runs N-S through center of SE4




- Township Survey 1915

 - No '47 Act ROW




Where did road come from? – First map "Agricultural Lands Matanuska Valley – 1929"




SE4 Conveyed to "ARRC" in 1935

- Set up to facilitate land transfers for agriculture to participants in the Matanuska Colony program.
- In order to make lands available to colonists ARRC purchased many existing homesteads.



e. Valley Roads:

Other than grader maintenance on the main travelled roads very little work was done in the valley this month. Three miles of brush were dozed off the sides of the Palmer-Matanuska road and 3/4 of a mile of fence erected where the plows tore it down last winter. Barbed wire was furnished two farmers who put up their own fences which we tore down last winter. In the future we do not plan to furnish any more wire or labor for fences damaged by snow removal. Farmers have been requested to move all fences back to give us a sixty foot right-of-way — otherwise winter snow removal may not be possible without damage to fences.






Dept. of Highways ROW – 1968 F-035-1(16) - SR3 From Wasilla SE to Jct. w/ SR1









COMMISSIONER'S QUITCLAIM DEED

THE GRANTOR, STATE OF ALASKA, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES, P.O. Box 196900, Anchorage, AK 99519-0690, hereinafter referred to as "the State", acting by and through its Commissioner, under the authority of A.S. 19.05.070, for and in consideration of One and No/100 ----(\$1.00) DOLLARS and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, subject to the below-described interests and conditions, does hereby release and quitclaim unto the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, whose mailing address is: 350 East Dahlia, Palmer, Alaska 99645, hereinafter referred to as "the Borough", all right, title, and interest, if any, not herein reserved unto the State, in and to that real property situated in the Palmer Recording District, Third Judicial District, State of Alaska, more particularly described as follows:

All of Jensen Road (CDS #170010) right of way, acquired upon statehood as a portion of Bureau of Public Roads route #5703, as depicted on Exhibit "A", and through use, located in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, within Township 17 North, Range 1 East, Section 16, Seward Meridian, from its junction with milepost 1.28 of the Parks Highway (CDS # 170000), commencing from the southerly right of way boundary of the Parks Highway, thence south for approximately 0.241 miles, more or less, to the road ending, as depicted on Exhibit "B", both Exhibits "A" and "B" being attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

What did DOT&PF convey to Mat-Su?



Exchange: certain roads would be paved by DOT and certain roads would be turned over to Mat-Su for maintenance & management

What did DOT&PF convey to Mat-Su?

Management: DOT & predecessors did not acquire any ROW.

Public prescriptive easements and dedications can be said to be held in trust for the public – there is no specific "ownership".

The DOT&PF CDV only transferred management authority.

The CDV claimed to be subject to utility permits issued by DOT including the power line to the west of Jensen road. (???)

DOT&PF issued utility permits are akin to a QCD, they are only valid to the extent that the DOT ROW is valid, a risk left for the utility to determine and accept or reject.

Utility likely has its own prescriptive easement for utility purposes only. The road prescriptive easement is limited to maintained area – top of cut to toe of fill (or back of ditch).
