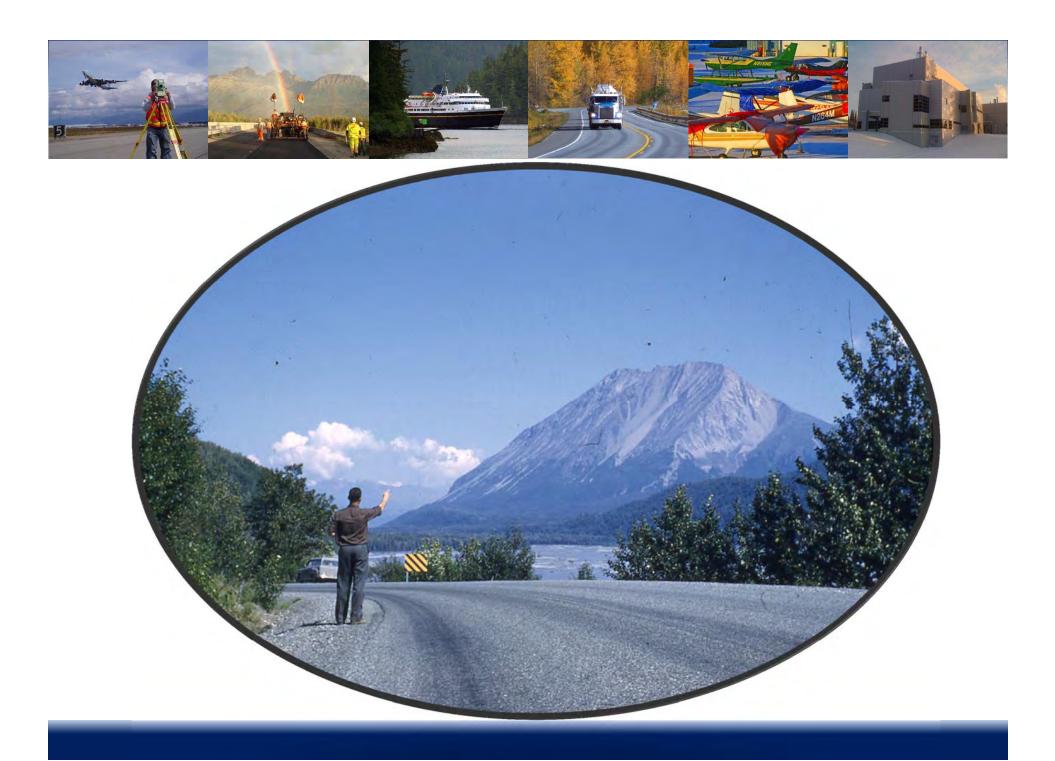

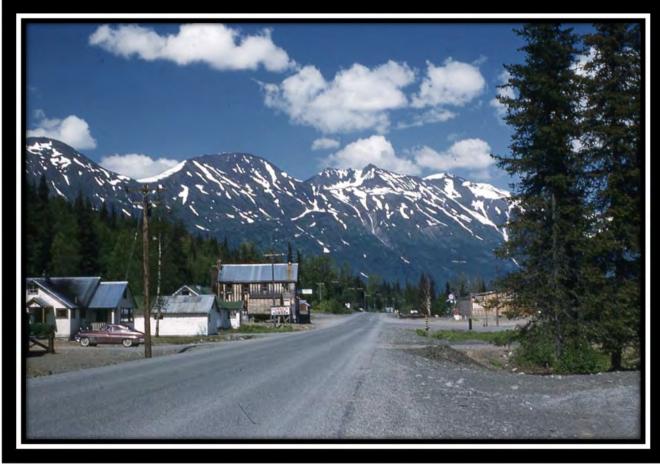

ENOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That Sherman John Chapman and Louvis Chapman, the undersigned owners of the land hereinafter described, in consideration of the sum of one (\$1.00) Dollar, lawful money of the United States of America and the construction and maintenance of a highway through and across the land hereinafter described, do hereby dedicate to the United States of America, through the Bureau of Public Roads, a Porpetual Easement for right-of-way for Public Highway purposes, through lands of the undersigned and more fully described as follows:

A 100' right-of-way, being 50' either side of the centerline of the Sterling Highway, through the S.J. Chapmen Addition, Anohor River Subdivision, located in the NET NET Section 4, Township 5 South, Range 15 West, of the Seward Meridian, as more specifically shown and deliniated in the plat made on October 10, 1954 by Henning N. Johnson, registered Land Surveyor, Torritory of Masks, Entitled "S. J. Chapman Addition, Anchor River Subdivision"; incorporated herein by reference, and made an intergral part hereof, a copy of which being on file in the Homer Recording District, United States Commissioner's Office, Homer, Alaska.

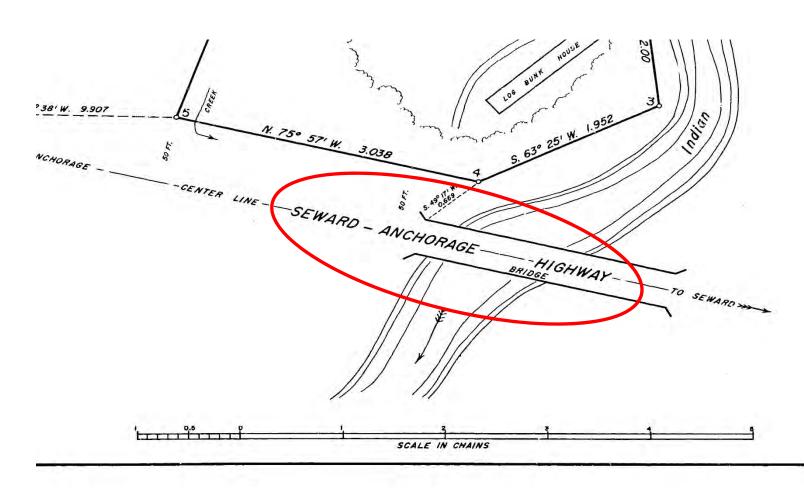




1952 Seward-Anchorage Highway USS 3215

The Manager of the Land Office at Anchorage, Alaska has transmitted a copy of the application of Harold A. Mokland, whose address is 1031 Cordova Street, Anchorage, Alaska for a free survey of his homesite, Anchorage serial No. 021508, under provisions of the Act of May 26, 1934 (48 Stat. 809).

The tract applied for is situated on the northerly side Alaska milroad and Seward-Anchorage Highway near the easterly boundary of U. S. Survey No. 1865, about 24 miles from Anchorage in approximate latitude 60° 59' 10" H. and longitude 149° 10" W. as scaled from U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey chart No. 8552.

The applicant submits a photostat of a sketch prepared by the U. S. Forest Service showing the lands under permit to him and listed as lots 1 and 2. This photostat serves in lieu of a metes and bounds description and is hereby made a part of these insuractions.

You are hereby authorized and instructed to execute the survey of the above described lots 1 and 2 as a single survey under U. S. Survey No. 3215 and thereby omitting the lot designations as the applicant has possession of both tracts, in strict conformity with existing laws, official regulations and instructions thereunder and the following special instructions.

The survey must not embrace an area greater than 5 acres.

The tract is within the boundaries of Public Land Order No. 797, which withdrew the lands from entry, but the claimant alleges prior existing rights.

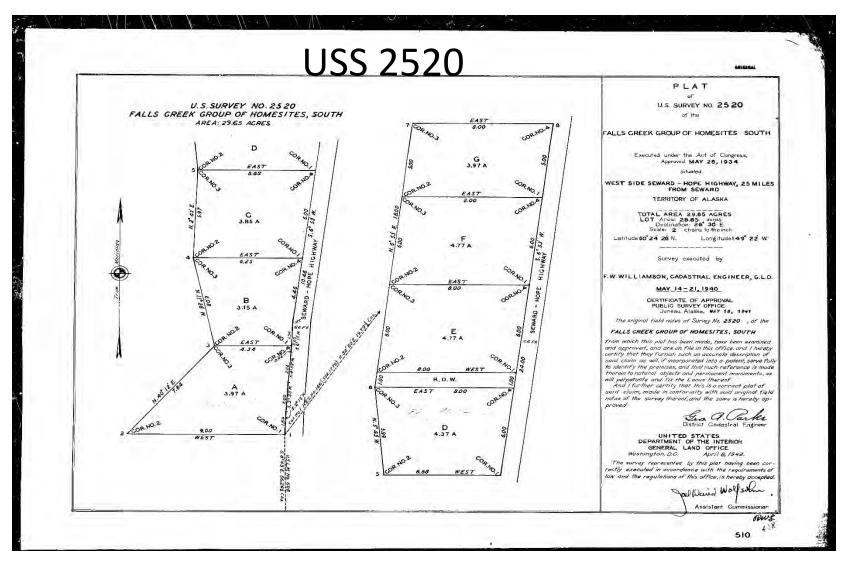

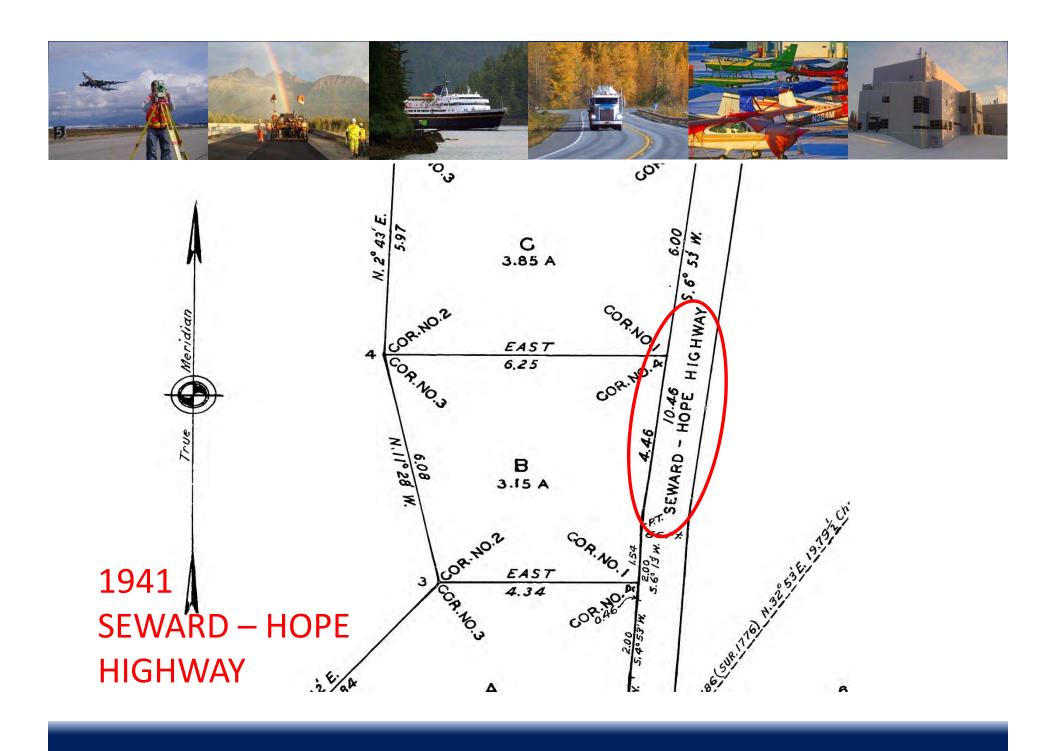

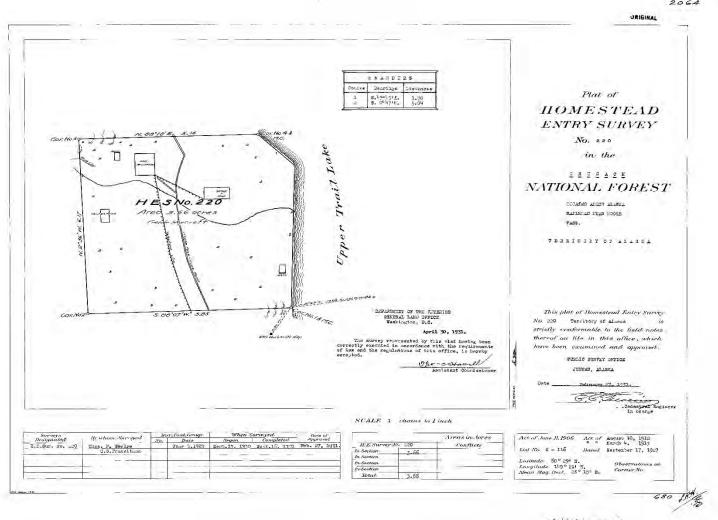

1941 Seward – Hope Highway

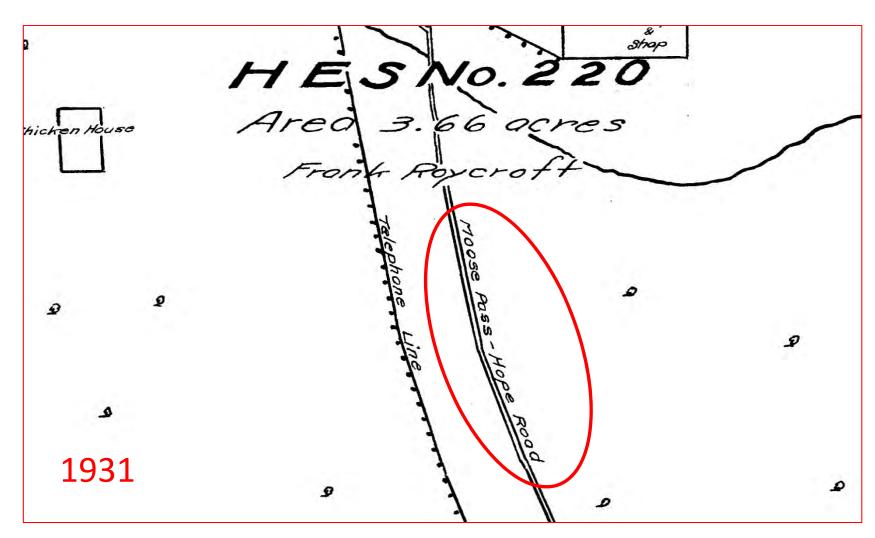




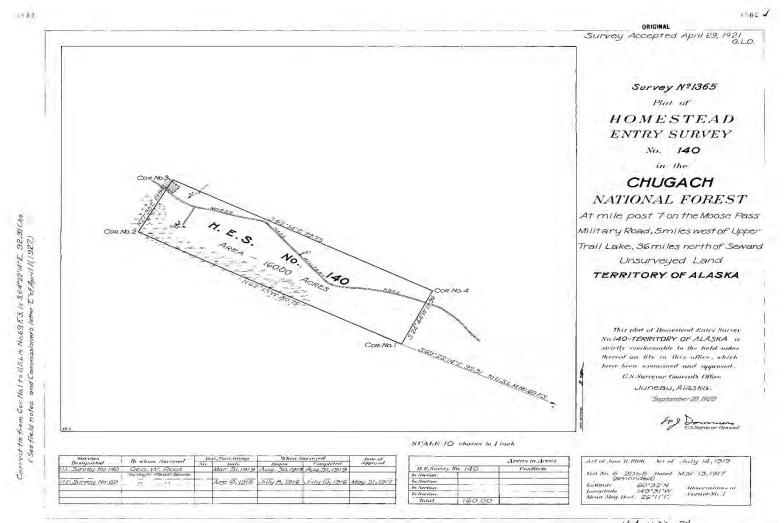
1931 Moose Pass-Hope Road



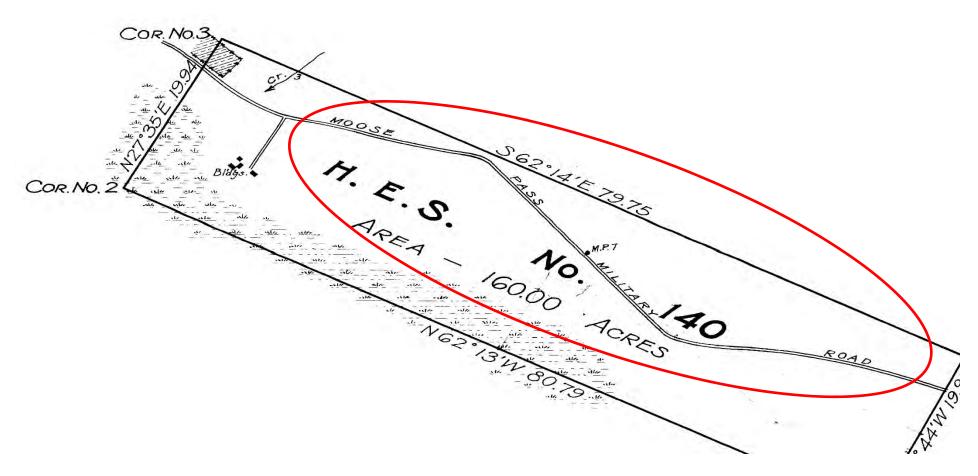




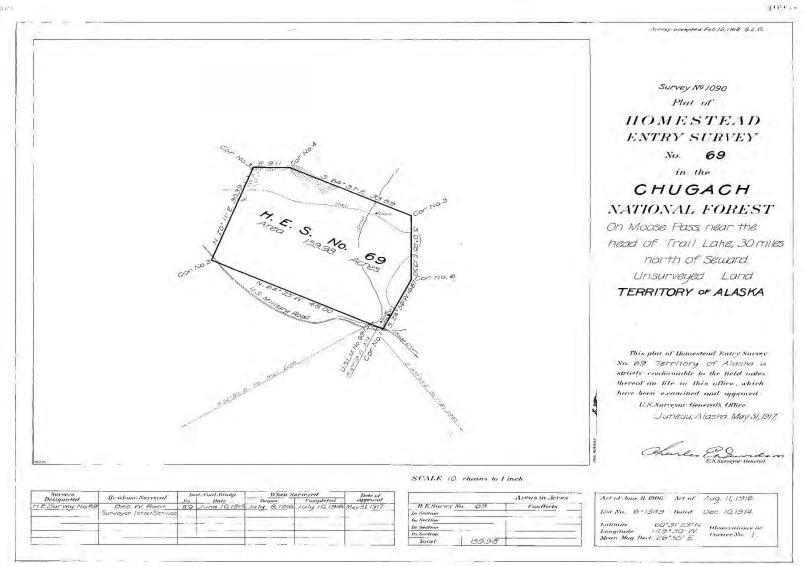

Lands involved: Weinel and Eisteinel of Lot 4 and Swinel and Wiselawi of Lot 5 Sec. 2 T. 3N., R. 12W., S.H., approximating 5.7 acres.

On February 2, 1949, Edward Lewis Karl Rothe of Kasilof, Alaska, a naturalized citizen (certificate #259445 issued by the Superior Court, San Francisco, California March 14, 1912) made application for a homesite on the above described lands. His application was filed in abcordance with the provisions of the Act of May 26, 1934 (AS Stat. 809; 48 U.S.C. 461, 43 CFR 6.46).

IDENTIFICATION OF THE LAND:

At the time of examination it was not possible to locate a permanent land monument closer to this land than the W.C.H.C. and the steel monument designating a section corner common to Secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10, T. 3N., E. 12W., S.H.

IMPROVEMENTS - RESIDENCE:

On October 1, 1949 this examiner located a two room log and frame constructed house 20' x 14' with attached storage shed, an abandoned shed 10' x 14' and a small abandoned log cabin 14' x 18' on the land embraced in this application.

These improvements located were within 300° of each other and within approximately 450° east of Cock Inlet. The main dwelling was very poorly furnished but showed signs of considerable use and is considered very habitable.

In Mr. Rothe's application he claims to have resided on the land continuously during the months from September 1000 until May 1 of the years between 1918 and 1948 inclusive. In an effort to confirm the claimed residence by the applicant, this examiner interviewed Emil Berg and Abraham Brickson who live along the Assilof River not too far distant from the lands cubraced

in this application.

Both Berg and Erickson stated that they were the only two persons now living who were in the area since 1917 and that they were the only persons who would have positive knowledge of Mr. Rothe's residence during the past years. Both stated that they knew Mr. Rothe personally and had gone into the area with him and they both indicated that they had actually seen Mr. Rothe living at his home on the subject land at least once weekly during all these years and knew for a fact that it was his only home.

RESERVATIONS:

While this land is located within a distance of 80 rods of the Kasilof River and Gook Inlet, it is not within a distance of 80 rods from any location theretofore made with Soldiers additional right or trade and manufacturing site, homestead, Indian or Sekimo allotment or shool indemnity selection. It is not included within an area which is reserved because of hot, medicinal or other springs. The land appeared to have no value for coal, oil, gas or other precious minerals. At the date of settlement no part of the land was claimed under the mining laws.

This homesite is within the area withdrawn by Public Land Order #487 dated June 16, 1948.

CONCLUSION:

From the facts gathered as presented in this report, it is this examiner's opinion that Edward Lewis Karl Rothe built a habitable house on the subject land and resided therein continuously for a period in excess of five months out of the year from the years 1918 until February 2, 1949. In the opinion of this examiner the applicant has a prior valid right for the subject land by virtue of constructing a habitable house and living on the land for a period of twenty-mine years thereby autedating the withdrawal as provided for under Fublic land Order #AS7 dated June 16, 1948.

In the opinion of this examiner Mr. Nothe is ably qualified to make this application for a box-site on the subject land in accordance with the provisions of the Act of May 26, 1934.

RECORDENDATIONS:

In view of the facts presented it is recommended that the applicant be permitted to purchase the subject 5.7 acres embraced in his homesite application upon construction of the supplemental plat. Upon his payment of the required fees it is recommended that final certificate and patent be issued on NEAREA and EASEANEA of Lot 4 and SWARWA and WASEANWA of Lot 5 Sec. 2 T. 3N., R. 12W., S.M., approximating 5.7 acres, to Edward Lewis Karl Rothe.

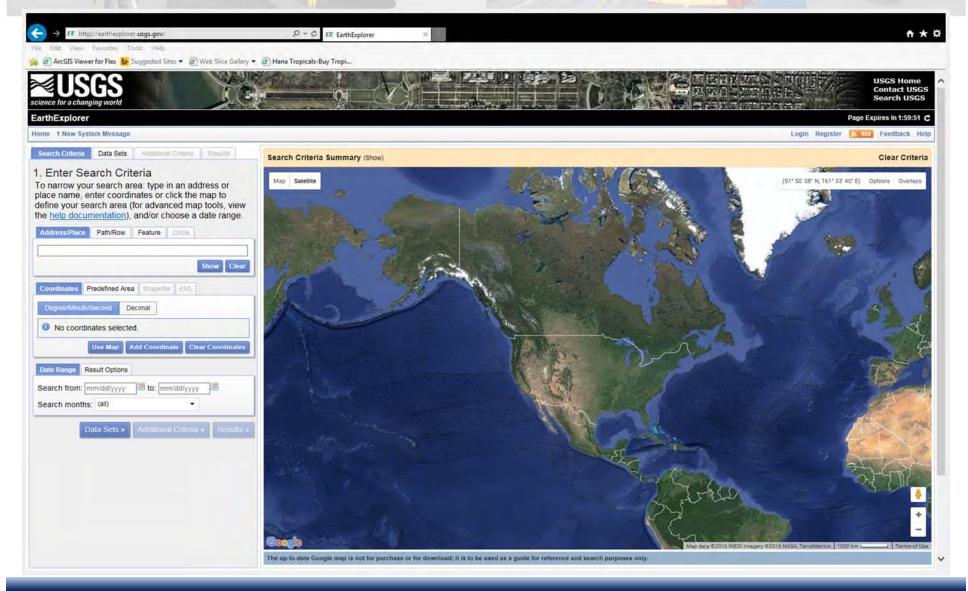


CONCLUSION:

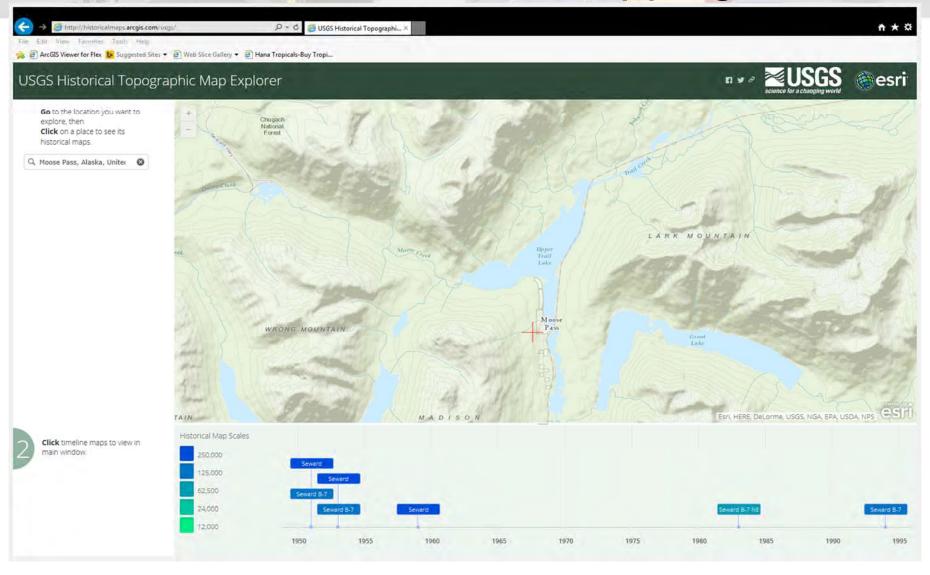

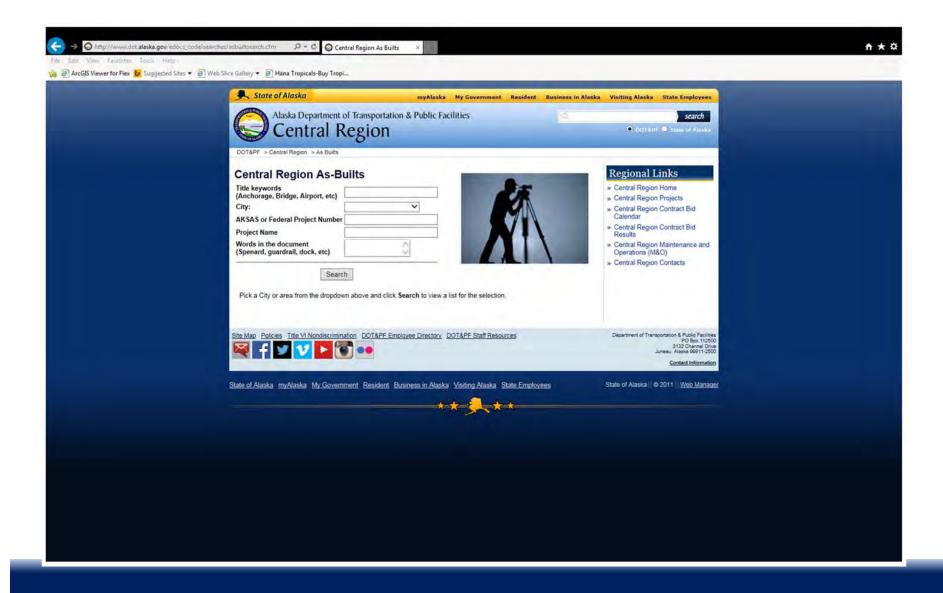




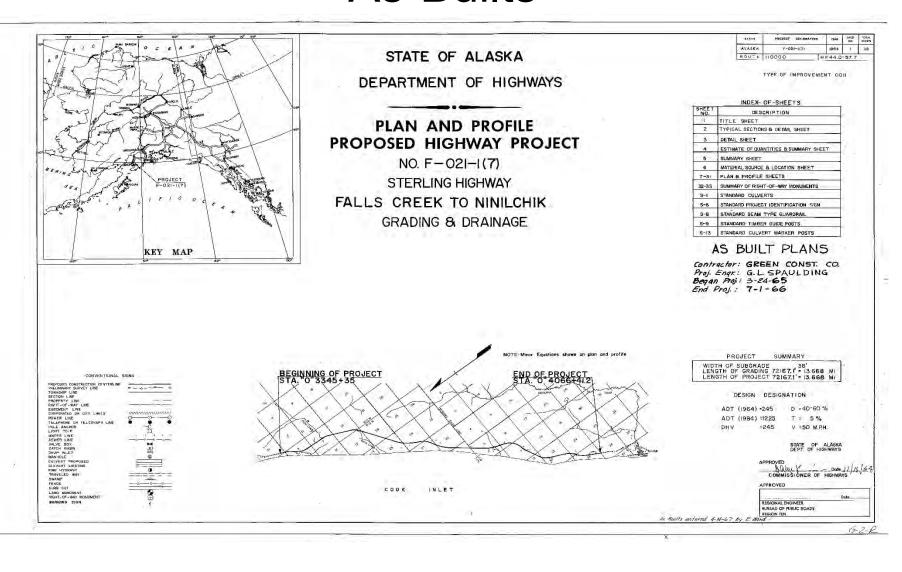
Central Region DOT ROW Site

inauguration of the construction season, a conference of Resident Engineers is held at a centrally located Interior point. It is at this conference that a concerted effort is made to encourage the uniform application of contract administration procedures set forth in the Contracts Administration Manual.

Survey and Road Design Branch

Pioneer Surveys

In addition to the usual staff supervision of all surveys, this Branch actively directed survey work in Southeastern Alaska during the fiscal year. Instrument survey of 28.8 miles of the Juneau-Canadian Boundary route, via the Taku River; aerial and ground reconnaissance of the Stikine River route to connect Petersburg and/or Wrangell with the Alaska Highway; and preliminary aerial reconnaissance of the Unuk River route to connect Ketchikan with the highway network, were completed during the year.

Considerable research is required of the Branch in the planning of future road surveys. Reconnaissance reports of the U. S. Geological Survey are studied as well as private engineering data and reports such as records of the abandoned Copper River and Northwestern Railway. A recent cooperative arrangement which has been developed utilizes advance joint reconnaissance by the Alaska Road Commission and the Geologic Engineer Branch of the U. S. Geological Survey. These studies provide invaluable information to the pioneer locator who follows, and facilitates his work by narrowing down the possible routes for the final road survey.

Cadastral Surveys

The cadastral survey program, whereby precise location of the highway system in relation to the public survey grid is established, was continued throughout the year under the direction of this Branch. This program, in the past confined to the primary system, was extended during the year to cover some of the farm road systems in more densely populated areas. Copies of completed plats are turned over to the Cadastral Engineer of the Bureau of Land Management, who utilizes them in his work.

The following report covers work accomplished in the Anchorage District in 1949 (December 1, 1948 to November 30, 1949). Farm and Industrial roads are mentioned under the Route to which they pertain, and are included in the maintenance mileage for that Route, but are reported under a separate heading of Farm Roads.

Route 35A - Mountain Roads:

Only minimum maintenance was done on the Mountain Roads. This included spring opening of ditches, culvert thawing, spot gravelling, and removal of slides from sidehill sections. Notor patrols maintained the the road surface.

Winter maintenance consisted of opening the roads to the Independence, Fern and Snowbird mines in December, January, February, April and November. Snowfall was extremely heavy in the Spring of 1949, and the roads closed for weeks at a time. The mines paid for this work on a cooperative basis beyond the read forks above Little Susitna Lodge where the old Road Commission mountain camp is located.

Route 35B - Wasilla Fishhook Palmer Roads:

Winter as well as summer maintenance was performed on this route as it is included in a school bus route. That portion of the Glenn Highway from the Palmer Railroad crossing to Hoose Creek is also included.

The route is also used extensively the year round by the settlers in the area as a farm to market road. Culverts were kept thawed, ditches kept open and the curves and hills sanded.

Summer work consisted of surface maintenance with graders, replacing of worn surfacing, slide removal from the sidehill sections and cutting of brush along the road and right-of-way to increase sight distance and reduce drifting of snow.



Route 35B - Wasilla Fishhook Palmer Roads:

MEMORANDUM FOR FILES:

SUBJECT: Policy regarding abandonment of roads

It shall be the policy of the Alaska Road Commission that roads within Alaska previously built or maintained by the Alaska Road Commission, will be abandoned only through the following procedure.

Formal written request for abandonment of any
particular section of road must be received from the parties recommending
such action or from the District Engineer of the Alaska Road Commission
District concerned.

2. Formal concurrence in the recommended abandonment will be obtained from the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners.

3. The public will be notified of the proposed abandonment by advertisement in the local papers and by notices posted on public bulletin boards, specifically in the areas to be affected by such abandonment. All such notices will request formal objections from any parties interested in the continued use of the road in question and will provide a period of not less than 30 days for the submission of such objections.

4. Upon the completion of the above three requirements, formal abandonment of the road will be authorized by the Commissioner of Roads for Alaska by an Alaska Road Commission Order.

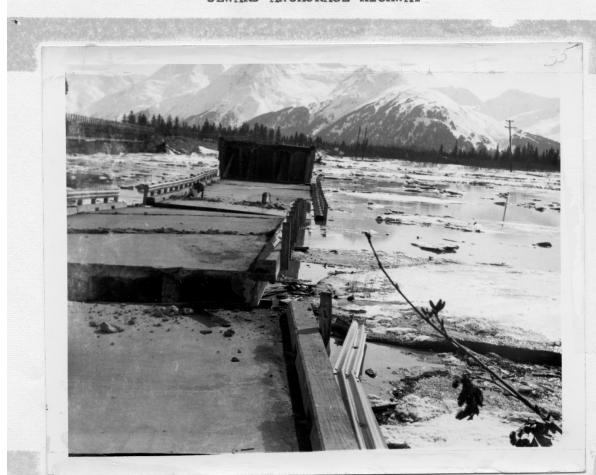

This project was completed during the past season. Nearly all was surfaced, but some short sections need additional material. This, however, can be taken care of on maintenance. A 14 foot road was built and opened for traffic.

Seward-Kenai Lake Road

This covers sections I and II, a total distance of 7 miles. Section 1 was completed in 1920. Section II was surveyed in 1921, and a contract for construction let to Slems & Carlson in June, 1921. This section was practically completed and auriaced when work closed down November 1st. There remains about one-half mile to be completed.

Quartz Creek-Russian River Road

Seven miles of 12 foot road and 6 miles of sleigh road was completed in 1921. A survey of an additional 12 miles was made connecting with the Moose Pass-Sunrise Road. The plane and estimates, however, have not yet been worked up, but will be completed this winter.

Cordova-Eyak Lake

1.6 miles of this project was completed prior to 1921. Since that date a location survey was made and construction started on an additional 4.53 miles of 10 toot road. About 3 miles of this work has been done and the balance will be huilt the coming season. When this is completed the road will extend to the Territorial Fish Hatchery.

Katalla Road

Longth 14 miles.

4.6 miles constructed in 1920. 9.4 miles in addition of old road was repaired, some new bridge and cordurey work done, and the road made passable to Chilkai. Bad portions of the road constructed in 1920 were surfaced and put in shape for wagon traffic.

Maintenance was done on all projects constructed under cooperative agreement up to December 31, 1921. \$4,395 Pederal funds and \$4,395 Territorial funds were allotted in the First Division, and \$4,445 Federal and \$3,720 Territorial was allotted in the Third Division.

In addition to the above, the Department has made Preliminary Investigation Reports covering the above projects, some of which may become conversity projects.

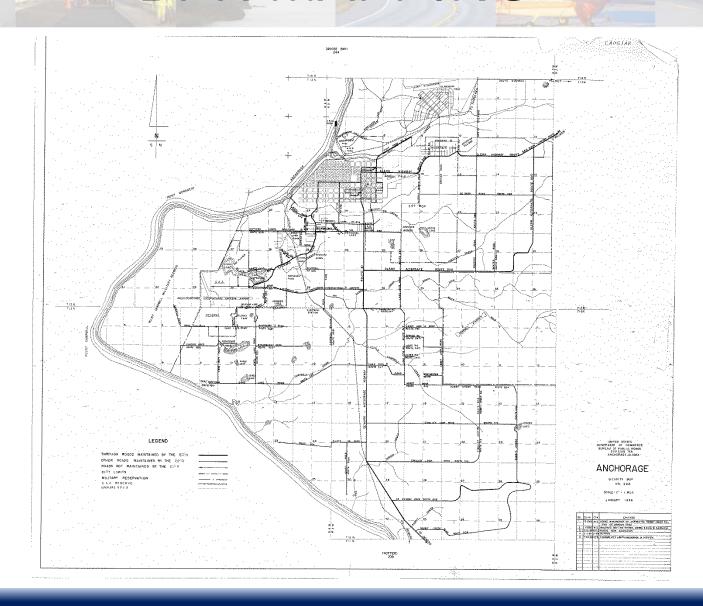
Construction on Forest Highway projects has been closed down except for work in progress on the Douglas Highway, Project 31-A7,B2, in the Juneau area, which is now about 50% complete, the north unit of the two projects at Ketchikan, and the work in progress by Lytle & Green on Project 3-A9 adjacent to Seward. Progress on these projects is described in detail in the attached reports from the District Engineers.

Of the work on Turnagein Arm, all projects have been closed down for the season with the exception of the F2 project under construction to Max J. Kuney Company. On the Kuney contract work is concentrated on the heavy rock and imported gravel embankments which may be readily handled under cold or wet weather conditions.

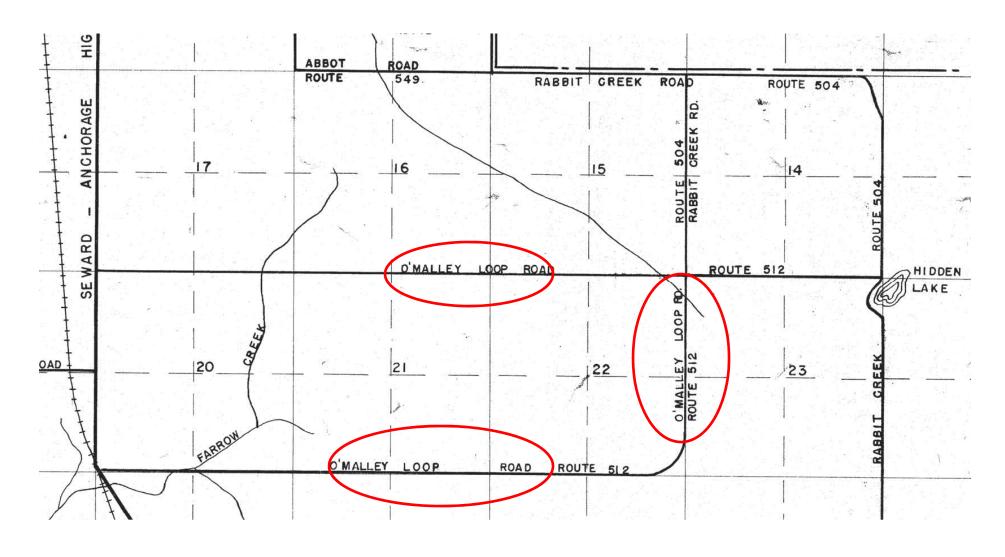
Field surveys have been completed except for work now being carried on between Mile 5 to Mile 12 on the Seward-Anchorage Highway north of Seward. Preparation of plans and completion of design are in progress for Sections F and H of the Richardson Highway in Juneau, and preparation for final construction plans for the principal contracts is being carried on by the resident engineers and their principal assistants for the projects under their supervision.

It was noted in the last report that the Alaska Road Commission would advertise for bids for Section F2. Glenn Highway, extending from Mile Post 102 to Mile Post 106, with bide to be opened on December 5. Six bids were received with Babler Bros, and Rogers Construction Company being the low bidder at \$1,223,057. The second bidder was S. Birch & Sons Construction Company and Morrison-Knudsen Company at \$1,565,989, with Peter Kiewit being the third at \$1,649.719. The engineer's estimate was \$1,663,494. On December 6 bids were opened on Section B3 of the Glenn Highway and Rebler Bros. and Rogers Construction Company were again low bidders at \$1,465,026. Four other bids were received, the second bidder being McLaughlin-Incorporated at 51.504.036, with S. Birch & Sons Construction Company and Morrison-Knudsen Company third at \$1,551,951. The engineer's estimate was \$1,737,142. It is expected that contracts will be awarded to Babler Bros. and Rogers Construction Company, low bidder on both sections. The bidding shows keen interest in the work and continuation of the trend for more favorable prices that has been previously noted. In this connection it should be noted that a time limit of October 15, 1951 was set. which is a year leter than was established in the original schedule, it

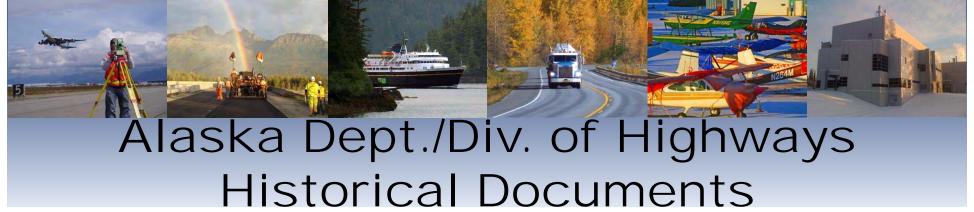

INTRODUCTION

Emergency work had to be completed as rapidly as possible to allow normal movement of traffic and critical supplies to the ravaged areas. This effort could not be absorbed with the already accelerated normal highway program and necessitated deferment of certain previously scheduled work.
